SUBJECT: Launch of Intelligence Fundamentals Professional Certification Program

I am announcing the formal launch of the Intelligence Fundamentals Professional Certification (IFPC) program. This milestone represents the further integration and professionalization the Defense Intelligence Enterprise (DIE) workforce through the establishment of individual professional certifications codified to national and departmental standards. The IFPC is uniquely designed and is open to all personnel engaged in defense intelligence work and provides an entry-level/developmental focus that was not previously available. It also provides our intelligence workforce in support professions (e.g., acquisition, financial management, human capital, etc.) a non-tradecraft specific intelligence certification that demonstrates a fundamental knowledge of the DIE. I want to thank you for your representatives' work in developing and now implementing this program and have attached a listing of personnel who were instrumental in developing the IFPC and delivering a very successful pilot test.

The genesis of the IFPC is based on the Department of Defense (DoD) Inspector General Report (No. DoDIG 2015-015), "Evaluation of DoD Intelligence Training and Education Programs for the Fundamental Competencies of the DoD Intelligence Workforce," which indicated critical skill gaps and a lack of knowledge and skill standards for entry-level/ developmental intelligence professionals. To address this gap, and fulfill the recommendations of the report, a DIE Subject Matter Expert (SME) Working Group and the Certification Governance Council developed standards based on work and knowledge requirements common to each of your components. Following a very successful pilot with volunteers from your organizations, the IFPC Program Management Office (CPMO) formally stood up to manage the candidates and the conferral processes. Steps are underway to automate many of the certification support activities, increasing efficiency for certification candidates, Components, and the CPMO. By automating these essential steps, the goal is to transition to a consolidated CPMO framework that will provide these functions for multiple certification programs across the DIE. The CPMO functions are anticipated to provide support in both the unclassified and classified environments. In the coming months, other certification programs will receive information to evaluate the consolidated CPMO framework in terms of the efficiency and savings that could be realized for

I urge all of you to complete designating your billets that require certifications. This is a key step in ensuring your mission areas have the right skills and proficiency in those positions. The IFPC was a missing piece that now allows a full spectrum of certifications available to you, as listed in the attached certification dashboard and tracker.

I want to express my sincere appreciation to all those that supported the development and continued implementation of the IFPC program. This program is critical as its content provides the foundation upon which other DIE certification programs are built and provides a bridge to facilitate entrance into the defense intelligence workforce. It was designed to address the recommendations of the DoD IG Report and be complementary of other DIE tradecraft certifications. Office of the Under Secretary of Defense for Intelligence will continue to monitor and provide oversight of the IFPC program through the DoD Intelligence Training and Education Board (DITEB). Quarterly IFPC updates will be provided to the DITEB members, Governance Council members, certification staff elements of the department, the National Security Staff team, and the Office of Personnel Management. #### **IFPC Pilot Test Summary**

- Testing available 3-17 March 2017 at 11 locations (see table below)
- Remote locations provided Pilot Testing Guide (proctor survey) to standardize testing environment
- Exam delivered via online testing platform
- 202 multiple choice questions developed by DIE subject matter experts
- Candidates took approximately 1.5 hours to complete (min 30 minutes, max nearly 3 hours)
- 341 candidates completed IFPC test
  - o Good mix of rank, age, years of intelligence experience, and education
